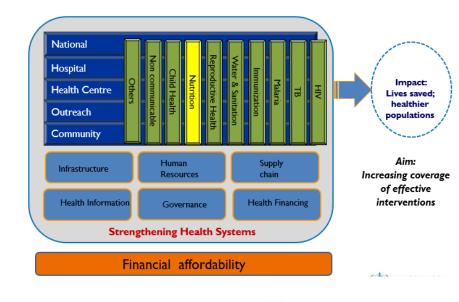


## **UN OneHealth Tool**

- Joint UN tool for modelling costs and impact of health plans
  - Interagency Working Group on Costing: UNFPA, UNICEF, UNDP, UNAIDS, UNWOMEN, WHO and the World Bank
  - System-wide approach rather than vertical programmes
  - Ingredients-based costing

#### Modular:

- Costing by programmes (e.g. nutrition)
- Costing by health system
- Impact modules (e.g. LiST Lives Saved Tool, NCD impact module)
- Health sector wide financial space analysis





## Planning and costing nutrition actions

#### The OneHealth Tool allows users to

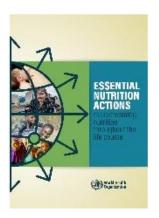
- estimate
  - cost and impact of different scaling-up scenarios
  - cost and impact of changes in treatment guidelines
- plan human resources development and the strengthening of systems for nutrition
- produce evidence-based assessment of costs and benefits, to advocate for increased investment in nutrition





## **Nutrition interventions in the OneHealth Tool**





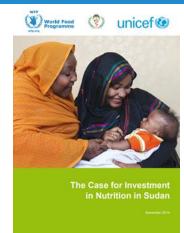


- Currently OHT nutrition module
  - WHO 2013 Essential Nutrition Actions with nutrition interventions targeting undernutrition and the 1,000 days
- Ongoing updates
  - WHO 2019 Essential Nutrition Actions

    - Targeting all forms of malnutrition
    - Targeting the entire life course
  - e-Library of Evidence for Nutrition Action (who.int/elena)
  - New guideline work, e.g. GDG on healthy diet policy actions
  - Protocols for treatment of micronutrient deficiencies
- All default data and assumptions can be customized according to national context

# Using OneHealth Tool for costing interventions to reduce anaemia

### Default assumptions included for

- Prevention (weekly and daily) and treatment through supplementation in
  - Children
  - Adolescent girls and WRA
  - Pregnant women
- Fortification of staple foods with iron and folic acid



## Consider using OneHealth Tool when

- Country already uses or is planning to use OneHealth Tool for sector wide or specific health plans (e.g. Health Sector Strategic Plan, maternal child health plan, nutrition plan)
- Programme will largely be implemented by the health sector
